# 1. Risk Assessment Table

Hazard	Likelihood (L)	Severity (S)	Risk Rating (R=L×S)	Control Measures	Action Required
Burns to performer	3	4	12	Flame-retardant clothing; gloves; trained performers; pre-show equipment check	Medium
Burns to audience	2	5	10	Maintain minimum 5m distance; barriers; safety assistant; pre-show briefing	Medium
Fire spreading to venue	2	5	10	Fireproof performance area; remove flammable materials; fire extinguisher & blanket on site	Medium
Smoke inhalation	2	3	6	Limit smoke effects; adequate ventilation; performers trained in safe techniques	Low

Equipment failure (torches, lycopodium devices)	2	4	8	Pre-show inspection; backup equipment available; proper storage	Medium
Slip/trip hazards from fuel or props	3	3	9	Clear area; wipe up fuel spills immediately; secure props	Medium

#### 2. Method Statement

#### **Step 1: Preparation**

- Inspect all fire equipment (torches, spark devices, lycopodium).
- Check fuel storage: flammable liquids in proper containers, away from performance area.
- Clear performance area of flammable materials; ensure fireproof surfaces where possible.
- Position audience at safe distance (min. 5m); use barriers and signage.
- Assign safety assistant with extinguisher and fire blanket.
- Brief performers on routine, emergency procedure, and communication signals.

#### **Step 2: Performance**

- Only trained and authorized performers handle fire equipment.
- Maintain a clear performance zone.
- The safety assistant remains attentive throughout the performance.
- Avoid performing in high winds or unsafe environmental conditions.

#### **Step 3: Emergency Procedure**

- If performer catches fire: stop, drop, and roll; safety assistant intervenes with fire blanket.
- Use an extinguisher immediately if fire spreads.
- Administer first aid for burns.
- Evacuate the audience if necessary.

#### Step 4: Pack Down

- Extinguish all equipment; check no smoldering debris remains.
- Store fuel safely in approved containers.
- Inspect equipment for damage; repair or replace as needed.
- Log any incidents or near misses.

# 3. PPE and Safety Equipment

- Flame-retardant clothing (long sleeves, natural fibers recommended)
- Heat-resistant gloves
- Fire blanket and extinguisher on site
- Safety assistant wearing high-visibility vest
- First aid kit on site

### 4. Personnel Responsibilities

- Lead Performer: Ensures safe handling of fire equipment; supervises performance
- Safety Assistant: Monitors performance area, audience safety, and handles emergencies
- Event Manager: Ensures venue safety compliance, manages audience, oversees emergency procedure

# 5. Audience Management

- Minimum 5m distance from performance zone
- Use barriers or ropes to prevent entry
- Clear signage indicating "Fire Performance Keep Distance"
- No smoking, flammable materials, or pets near performance zone
