1. Risk Assessment Table

2. Method Statement

Step 1: Preparation

- Inspect stilts for damage, tighten fittings, check padding.
- Clear performance area of obstacles and debris.
- Mark audience boundaries with barriers or floor tape.
- Brief performers on show order and emergency procedure.

Step 2: Performance

- Only trained performers to use stilts.
- Spotters positioned around the performance area.
- Performers perform pre-rehearsed routines.
- Maintain audience distance; no crowding.

Step 3: Emergency Procedure

- If a performer falls, the spotter assists safely.
- First aid kit available on site.
- Evacuate the audience if needed.

Step 4: Pack Down

- Inspect stilts for damage; store safely.
- Remove barriers and reset performance area.
- Record any incidents in log.

3. PPE and Safety Equipment

- Helmet and knee/elbow pads for performers (if appropriate)
- Sturdy footwear with grip
- Spotters with high-visibility vests
- First aid kit on site

4. Personnel Responsibilities

- Lead Performer: Safety checks, performance supervision
- Spotters: Maintain audience distance, assist in falls
- Event Manager: Ensure area cleared, manage emergency procedure

5. Audience Management

- Maintain safe distance: min. 2m from performance
- Use clear signage
- Ensure no children or pets enter performance zone
